## **CFC Journey Log Entries**

Please ensure you conclude all flights by filling out the journey logbook, including PIC signature and license number.

A reminder on how to properly snag and report a defect discovered *during flight*. Once the pilot and aircraft are safely back on the ground, the defect must be written in the defect column of the journey log, include a description of what occurred. Please ensure you return the journey log to dispatch and inform them of the snag, maintenance will then be notified.

CFC's Maintenance Control Manual allows snags discovered while *on the ground* to be reported to maintenance without the need of a journey log entry. If a snag is discovered during a walk around, please advise dispatch of the problem to see if the issue can be resolved prior to flight.
